HOW TO JOIN?

QUESTIONS

What are the time requirements?

Time commitment varies by organization. Members are encouraged to pursue leadership roles to build connections on campus with other fraternities, sororities, and student organizations. In general, the time associated with joining a fraternity or sorority equates to the time required for an academic course. Ultimately, you will get out of this experience what you put into it!

Do I have to hold a certain identity to be in a multicultural organization?

No, each organization is welcoming of individuals from all identities and backgrounds. Although these organizations were founded to support Latinx/a/o, Asian/Asian American, and LGBTQ+ members, they are not exclusive to those identities.

What are the annual costs associated with being a part of the Multicultural Greek Council?

Each organization requires different costs for membership, however, none of the organizations have chapter structures. This breakdown also does not include council dues or the \$25 FSL Programming Fee that are both assessed each semester. and resource centers.
